Collaborating closely with clients, students identified the needs and opportunities to reflect each client's interests and personalities. - Seniors made the best of a challenging final year of Upper School and explored new learning opportunities, such as online one-act plays and music videos for Postcards from the Pandemic, virtual and in-person community events, and research projects. They impressed us with their thoughtful decisions for the next stage in their journeys.
